In order to promote our agency and the support that we provide, we attended several different community events in August. The first were back to school events at Novinger, Green City, Schuyler County, Scotland County, and Kirksville schools. We also hosted an inclusion workshop and information table at the Community Roots Festival.

The 2019 Community Engagement Conference is coming up on October 8th. Many of the details for the conference were finalized in August and registration for the event is open. Letters were also sent to community agencies and organizations to invite them to attend the conference and support us as either sponsors or vendors. As Truman resumed classes for the fall, several of our partnerships with University programs began as well.
